Details of the Workshops

Module 1

- 1. Listening Skill The receptive skill was practiced by the students to help improve their language. This included-
 - 1. listening for relevance (rather like reading for gist)
 - 2. monitoring (listening to spot something important)
 - 3. intensive listening (trying to understand as much as possible)
 - 4. extensive listening (listening to follow the main points of what is being said)



Module 2

Speaking: The students were given ample practice with activities to improve their speaking skills. Activities tried to imbibe the following in the learners-

- 1. Interaction- speaking to all in the social wheels and maintain relationships with people.
- 2. Transaction- speaking to get something done such as getting a service, asking for information, giving an explanation etc. Students participated in simulation tasks such as: -
 - Role Plays
 - Mock Interviews
 - Telephone conversations
 - Anchor and discussant
- 3. Turn-taking (understanding when to speak and when someone else wants to speak)



Module 3


<u>Reading-</u>Reading activities were done to improve the communication skill. Students were involved in reading activities to help improve their cognitive abilities. Learners were guided to read for-

- skimming (reading for general gist)
- scanning (reading to locate details)
- intensive reading (reading for the fullest possible understanding)
- extensive reading (reading to follow the gist or get the general picture)

Writing Skill-Students were guided to understand the process of writing, different strategies and modes of writing were done during the workshops. The students were brainstormed, their thoughts were organized, revised and polished.







Report on NSS Day Celebration

Day: 25th September 2023

Venue: Shri H. L. Gupta Auditorium

Item/Activity: Demonstration on "First Aid and Casualty Management."

Total No. of Participants: 60 Attended

The NSS Unit of the MIER College of Education celebrated NSS Day by organizing a guest lecture cum demonstration on the subject of "First Aid and Casualty Management." A group of Jammu-based Civil Defence Organization professionals served as the team's resource persons. They included Mr. R.D. Sahini, the team's manager, and Mr. Purshotam and Mr. Rajendar, instructors.

An NSS volunteer, Ms. Shruti Bhasin welcomed the guests, and everyone present on the occasion. She gave a brief overview of the day's significance and mentioned that September 24 has been recognized as NSS Day and observed across the nation since 1969. It commemorates the official launch of India's public service initiative.

The resource persons emphasized first-aid casualty management and based on the Triage System, they claimed that casualties might need to be moved to a safer treatment area for safety concerns. The person can be identified by one of the red, yellow, green, or black tags by looking at each criterion, and first aid can be administered in accordance with that tag's colour.

They also outlined the crucial rules that a first responder or first aid provider must follow, including assessing the situation swiftly and calmly, deciding whether the provider or the casualty is in danger, and making arrangements for help as soon as possible. The teachers also went through the steps and precautions for performing CPR and clearing breathing obstructions. After the training, a first aid and casualty management demonstration was given, showing how to make and improvise stretchers and stop bleeding. Dr. Adit Gupta praised the NSS Unit for putting together such a successful program. He stated that first aid is crucial since it can save a person's life in an emergency. Since there is always a race against time in most medical situations, acting swiftly is crucial. Such orientation is necessary for NSS volunteers because they assist with disaster relief and community welfare. The program was expertly managed by Ms. Vanshika Salaria, and Ms. Kanishka officially thanked the experts and NSS volunteers. The event was organized under the supervision of NSS Program Officer Dr. Reeta Dwivedi.



He said there is no doubt that fraudsters are getting trickier with each passing day, but we must take precautions and security measures.

Ms. Alisha Vaid, student of 2nd semester, also explained the use of generic medicines. She said before purchasing the medicine, one should check the manufacturing and expiry date as well.




