
Report






# Report

Mr. Rahil explained various modes of digital transactions and the use of different mobile ap like Googal Pay, PAYTM, UPI, E Wallet, E banking etc. Additionally, He claimed that with t launch of UPI transactions, digital payments in India had made a significant advancement However, he cautioned that scammers quickly adjusted and developed several strategies to tricustomers, created forged virtual payment addresses for refunds, disaster support, etc. as well false cash back offers and QR codes to deceive collect requests. He said there is no doubt the fraudsters are getting trickier with each passing day, but we must take precautions and secur measures.

Ms. Alisha Vaid, student of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, also explained the use of generic medicines. She sate before purchasing the medicine, one should check the manufacturing and expiry date as well.

## Report

The Extension Unit of MIER College of Education organized an awareness programme by conducting a guest lecture on the theme "Tuberculosis and its Precautions and Treatment" at its adopted village Purkhoo. The main aim of this programme was to develop awareness regarding tuberculosis and its devastating health, social and economic consequences, in addition to its preventive measures. Around 15 students from the School of Education, MCE, participated in the activity along with their incharge, Mrs. Suman Devi. Dr. Manju Bhat, medical officer at the Govt. Ayurvedic Hospital, was the resource person for the programme.

Dr. Manju Bhat comprehensively deliberated on the topic and explained that tuberculosis (TB) is a bacterial infection caused by Mycobacterium tuberculosis. It primarily affects the lungs but can also affect other parts of the body. TB is a contagious disease that spreads through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes. Its causes, symptoms, types, precautions, and medication were briefly clarified. She also shared some preventive measures to reduce the risk of spreading TB among village people. In addition, Dr. Manju provided important guidelines and said that TB is not a lifelong infection and can be cured by eating healthy, taking regular medication and seeking professional guidance.

Ms. Mansi Verma, a B.Ed. student, also highlighted that it is a contagious disease caused by airborne bacteria and explained how people of different age groups can protect themselves from the infection.

Dr. Adit Gupta, Principal MIER College, appreciated the efforts of the unit and thanked the doctors for the successful organization of the awareness programme. Earlier Ms. Khushi Sharma, student B.Ed. 4<sup>th</sup> Semester, a warm welcome to the resource person.
