### Report of the Activities Conducted in collaboration with Commonwealth of Learning (COL), Vancouver, Canada

MIER College of Education entered into a Contribution Agreement with the Commonwealth of Learning (COL), Vancouver, Canada on February 8, 2021. Under this agreement the COL shall support adoption and implementation of policies and strategies for technology-enabled learning to improve the quality of learning outcomes and fostering of innovations. COL shall also support the college for institutionalizing the adoption of Technology-Enabled Learning through research, consultation, capacity building, monitoring and evaluation.



### **C-DELTA Workshop**

A three-week Training of Trainers pogramme was organised in collaboration with Commonwealth of Learning (COL) to train teachers to use the Commonwealth Digital Education Leadership Training in Action (C-DELTA) platform and develop their capacities in using digital resources in the teaching-learning process in their respective schools/educational institutions. The participants participated enthusiastically and were engaged in number of activities. It was organized from April 3, 2021, to April 30, 2021.



### **Workshop on TEL Policy Development**

A three-day online workshop was organised on Policy Development in collaboration with the Commonwealth of Learning (COL) from June 28 to June 30, 2021. The aim was to provide technical assistance for mainstreaming the use of Technology-Enabled Learning (TEL) at the MIER College of Education. This will be a three-phase process including, a baseline study, adoption of a TEL policy, capacity building of teachers to develop blended courses, use of learning management system and open repositories, research on student learning, networking and collaboration through TEL Community of Practice, and benchmarking of TEL.

### Report of the New Colombo Plan in collaboration with Curtin University Australia

Curtin University, Perth, Australia collaborated with MIER College of Education to undertake educational activities under its New Colombo Plan project. The aim of this partnership was to establish a connection between students in India and Australia and provide them a highly progressive educational opportunity that aims at making them adaptable and confident in any teaching environment. The officials of both the colleges discussed about the planning and execution of the Colombo Plan effectively. Dr. Rekha Koul gave guidelines for conducting this programme such as identification of teacher trainees and preparing schedules for organising various activities. Discussion was also held on the preparation related to technology platform to be adopted and procurement of tabs for the students who were going to participate in this programme.

### **Introductory Session**

An interactive session was held between the students of both the countries. The aim was to bring students together to grow and innovate as the educators of tomorrow. By providing an authentic intercultural and educational program to lift knowledge of the Indo-Pacific region, Curtin University and MIER College students developed their own teaching prowess in an agile environment while considering how 21st century education imperatives inform contemporary teaching practices. Building an initial relationship with their fellow students was integral to the success of the New Colombo Plan project, and so Dr. Sheffield and Dr. Gupta co-ordinated an engaging and constructive introductory experience for students prior to their educational program. Students commenced their collaborative process by crafting an introductory video providing a snapshot of their daily life and future goals and ambitions.





### **Inaugural Function**

An online programme was organised to inaugurate the New Colombo Plan on May 25, 2021. Ms Dantu Charandasi, Consulate General of India in Perth was the Chief Guest on this occasion while Brett Galt-Smith, Counsellor (Education and Research) joined from the Australian High Commission New Delhi. Prof. Rachel Sheffield welcomed all the dignitaries from Australia and India and said this programme will open new educational avenues between two countries and will prove to be transformational, deepening Australia's relationships in the region, both at the individual level and through expanding university, business and other links. Prof Seth Kunin, Deputy Vice-Chancellor International, Curtin University and Prof Adit Gupta, Principal MIER College of Education also expressed their appreciation for this initiative. Prof Rekha Koul in her Closing remarks thanked all the dignitaries and participants and conveyed her wishes for the grand success of the programme.

### **Workshop on Preparing Effective Lesson Plans**


