
STUDENTS' VISITS

INCLUSIVE SCHOOL

MIER College of Education has set up the first Inclusive School under the auspices of the Department of Special Education(MR/ID) at Model Academy. The idea behind setting up of an Inclusive school is to ensure that students with special needs gain access to quality education, knowledge, skills and information.

A wide range of activities for the children with special needs were organised by the Inclusive School. These activities were designed keeping in mind the needs of children with different disabilities ranging from Down syndrome, Autism, Physically Challenged, Mentally Challenged (MR) as well as

Learning disabilities (LD). Special sessions on counselling, physiotherapy, speech therapy, creative strategies to make reading and math easily learnable were also conducted for the benefit of these children. The school arranged frequent visits by specialists in various areas of disability to cater to the special needs of the children.







WORKSHOPS

Two workshops were organised to create awareness and to sensitize the teaching fraternity and parents of children with special needs by the department of Special Education, MIER College.

RCI Sponsored Three Days Workshop

A three day workshop sponsored by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) was organized from November 26 to 28, 2015. The purpose was to develop awareness and positive attitudes about the rights as well as abilities of the persons with special needs. The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), MHRD along with RCI had sponsored the training workshops for key functionaries dealing with disabilities sector of central and state governments,





local bodies, and other service providers. For the State of J&K was the Chief Guest. Dr. K.R. Arya, Chairperson, North Jammu and Kashmir, this responsibility was entrusted to Zonal Coordination Committee, RCI was the Guest of MIER College of Education.

More than 50 participants including principals and teachers from government and private schools in Jammu district participated in the workshop. Madam Priya Sethi, Hon'ble Minister of State for Information, Education and Culture,

There were eight technical sessions on three major themes such as Disability-Life Cycle Approach, Inclusion and Accessibility and Govt. Policies, Schemes, Acts, Rights and Entitlements.

WORKSHOP ON INCLUSION

A one day workshop in collaboration with MIER College and Babu Jagjiwan Ram Trust, an NGO in Himachal Pradesh was sponsored by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) was organized on April 26, 2016.

The theme of the workshop was "Journey towards Inclusion". About 50 teachers from government and private schools in Jammu district participated in the workshop. Parents of children with special needs from Model Academy also participated in this workshop. Dr. K.R. Arya, Chairperson, North Zonal Coordination Committee, chaired the workshop.

There were three technical sessions on themes namely, Inclusion and Accessibility, Educational Strategies for Successful Inclusion and Screening Tools for Identification of PWDs and Referrals Services. Dr. Rohnika Sharma, HoD, Special



Education Dept., MIER College of Education; Dr. Bharti Tandon, and Mr. Rajendra Praveen, Assistant Professors from the MIER College and Mrs. Harika Singh, Incharge Inclusive School, Model Academy were the resource persons for the workshop.

To understand the new curriculum introduced at the B.Ed., B.Ed. Special and M.Ed. levels by the NCTE and RCI, a series of subject specific extension lectures were organized for the benefit of faculty and students.

ACTION RESEARCH

Dr. G.S. Sodhi, Former Professor, Department of Education, Punjab University, Chandigarh was invited to deliver lecture on "Action Research" to the students and the staff of the college on September 21, 2015.

Prof. Sodhi explained the process of action research as a process of systematic inquiry that enables the teacher to find effective solutions to real problems encountered in day-to-day teaching. Deliberating upon the importance of action research, Prof. Sodhi highlighted that action research helps the educator to critically investigate the process of teaching and learning for quality outputs, improve school practices and policies. He shared common problems related to teaching-learning process that are faced by teachers and discussed the interventions that could be used to overcome those issues.



PHILOSOPHY AND HIGH LEVERAGE PRACTICES

Dr. Harish Sharma, Former Professor, Punjab University, Chandigarh delivered a series of lectures to the staff and



Students of the college on the theme "Philosophy and High Leverage Practices" on September 21, 2015.

Prof. Sharma deliberated on the topic extensively and brought out clearly the connection and utility of the terms of metaphysics, epistemology, axiology, logic and ethics. He expanded upon the concept of core or high leverage practices in teaching and focussed on the disjoint between theory and practices. The disconnect between the preservice teacher preparation programmes and the problems in the real classroom were also discussed by the resource person. He observed that acquainting teacher-trainees with core practices help them become well-started beginning teachers who are able to engage in the work of teaching with integrity.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

Dr. Sushma Sharma, Professor, Department of Education, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra was invited as a resource person to deliver a lecture on the theme "Inclusion and Inclusive Settings" on September 23, 2015. Dr. Sharma explained that Inclusive education happens when children with and without disabilities participate and learn together in the same classes and deliberated on the importance of educating children with exceptionalities in an appropriate way without hurting their self respect. Dr. Sharma also expanded upon the teaching strategies that could help in implementing inclusion at different school levels. In addition, she highlighted the progress in the special education field in the global context. Dr. Sharma provided ample examples that could help



in promoting inclusive education at different levels in the school.

CHALLENGES OF TEACHER EDUCATION

A lecture on the theme "Challenges of Teacher Education in Present Scenario" was delivered by Professor R.G. Kothari, Professor, M.S. University, Vadodra on December 16, 2015. He deliberated on the importance of professionalization of teaching and teacher education programmes for ensuring quality in teacher education. He further emphasized that higher education institutions have an important role to play in developing effective partnerships with schools and other stakeholders to ensure that their teacher education courses are based upon research evidences and good classroom practices. Prof. Kothari also explained the concept of teacher effectiveness, its determinants, characteristics and significance of research activities in teacher education.



COMPARISON BETWEEN AMERICAN AND INDIAN SCHOOL SYSTEM



In keeping with the rich tradition of the college to invite luminaries in the field of education, Dr. Gurucharan Singh Bhalla, Former Professor, Bronx University, New York, USA was invited to deliver a lecture on the theme "Comparison of American and Indian Education System; How to Improve Indian Schools" to the staff and students of M.Ed. department on February 25, 2016. Dr. Bhalla interacted with the teacher trainees and acquainted them with the system of school education prevalent in America especially the public schools and also compared teacher education in both countries. He elaborated upon the American system of schooling and teacher preparation programmes. He informed that in U.S. educational institutions could have different mission statements but common goals.

ENDEAVOUR SCHOLARSHIP ORIENTATION

Dr. Adit Gupta, Joint Director, MIER and Ambassador, Endeavour Scholarships and Fellowships, oriented the faculty of the college about the Endeavour Scholarships on May 23, 2016. These scholarships are the Australian Government's competitive, merit-based scholarships and fellowships providing opportunities for both Australians and international scholars to undertake study, research or professional development programmes in Australia and in other countries. He explained about the criteria of these programmes in addition to application process and its deadline. Dr. Gupta also shared his experiences and benefits as an awardee of this scholarship.



CENTER FOR EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH (CER)

RESEARCH AWARDS

MIER College of Education(Autonomous) in collaboration with Model Institute of Engineering and Technology (MIET) organized a Research Award Function at MIET campus on April 30, 2016. The Research Awards are a unique initiative by the MIER Group to encourage research by providing financial incentives and recognition to faculty members for producing quality research output.

Prof. Jigar Mohammed, Dean Research Studies, University of Jammu was the Chief Guest on the occasion, while Dr. Arun K. Gupta, Chairman, MIER Group presided over the function. Twelve faculty members of the college were felicitated and provided cash incentives of Rs.76, 500/- at the event for publishing 30 research papers at various prestigious fora.




STANDING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETINGS

The sixth edition of MIER Journal of Educational Studies, Trends and Practices (MJESTP) has been published. It is a bi-annual international peer reviewed indexed journal.

It provides a platform for researchers, practitioners, innovators and policy makers to share their research findings, new innovations, trends and developments in the field of education. The Journal is indexed with WorldCat, Google Scholar, Educational Research Abstracts and The University of Illinois OAI-PMH Data Provider Registry. The prestigious Thomson Reuters Indexing has also recently included MJESTP in its list of indexed journals. Scholars and Researchers are invited to contribute their research papers for publication in the bi-annual journal.

CENTER FOR EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH (CER)

RESEARCH COLLOQUIA

Conducting research colloquia is a regular feature of the centre. Three research colloquia on different topics were organised for the benefit of the staff and students.

Research findings of the major research project sponsored by the UGC were shared with the faculty of the college and students of M.Ed. department on October 21, 2015. The theme was "Education Facebook: A Community Network for Stakeholders in Education". The principal investigator was Dr. Arun Gupta while Dr. Ankur Gupta was Coinvestigator. The project team also included Dr. Nishta Rana and Dr. Moolraj Sharma. They presented a comprehensive project report. More than 4000 subjects comprising students and teachers in institutions of higher education were involved in the study in the Jammu region. The results indicated both students and teachers favoured the use of social networking and technology supported classrooms to improve the quality of higher education in



India. An Educational Community network was also created during the course of the study which was easy to access and provided 24x7 connectivity between different stakeholders.





A research colloquium on the topic "Factors Influencing Emotional Intelligence among B.Ed. Students of Himachal Pradesh" was organised on February 4, 2016. The resource person was Dr. Atul Thakur, Assistant Professor, MIER College of Education. Dr. Thakur emphasized that despite the recognition of the importance of promoting emotional intelligence in schools, teacher curriculum has been slow to incorporate emotional literacy into their structure. Furthermore, for emotional intelligence to have relevance for education, students need to be educated to become knowledgeable, responsible, and able to deal effectively with their emotions and teacher educators could guide them in doing so rather than providing basic instructions in traditional areas.


Dr. Bharti Tandon, Assistant Professor, MIER College of Education, dwelt upon the topic "Exploration of a Special Educator's Contributions to Co-teaching in Relation to Content and Pedagogical Content Knowledge (PCK)" in a research colloquium organised on March 22, 2016. The results indicated that the special education teacher contributed both in planning and in teaching The study provided fine grained analysis of these contributions. Dr. Tandon highlighted that in recent years the Government of India has strongly advocated for teaching children with different abilities in the same classroom with their non-disabled peers. An interactive session was held at the end.



RESEARCH STATISTICS







CENTRE FOR EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY (CET)

CET is the backbone of the college for improving the quality of instructions and teaching learning process by disseminating information and providing training about new and modern technologies and their use in classroom. It is also making efforts to popularize practices like E-learning (both online and offline) and educational use of mobile, social media and satellite technologies.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES



The centre organised following training programmes for the staff of the college:

A training programme was organised on October 27, 2015 for using new technology enabled classrooms set up by Teach Next to enhance the ICT based teaching skills and to familiarize the faculty with the latest trends in educational technology.

Skill enhancement training for using the various features of Academia ERP software was conducted on May 6, 2016. During the training the different modules of the software such as admission, student information system, declaration of result etc. was provided to both the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The software is now being used by the staff on regular basis in the day to day functioning of the college.

The centre also conducted training programmes for teacher trainees on Use of Educational Technology.

ONLINE ADMISSION PORTAL

Taking initiative from the UGC directive regarding online admissions to universities, the MIER College has created an Online Admission Portal for admissions to all courses from the session 2016. The portal provides many features to facilitate seamless admission process. This facility has made the admission process effective, accurate and convenient for the candidates as well as for the college. The process of admissions right from advertisements, e-brochure, submitting of online forms and payments, downloading of admit cards, declaration of results etc. have been provided on this portal.

STANDING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETINGS



The standing and advisory committee meetings were held in which detailed review of the activities of the centre were done. Dr. Mool Raj Sharma, Centre Head presented a comparative analysis of the progress of the centre since its inception and gave a glimpse of the future projects of the centre. The members appreciated the efforts of the centre in promoting the use of ICT among the students and the staff and also gave suggestions for further improving the functioning of the centre.

TECHNOLOGY DAY

An orientation programme on "Free Online Courses" was organised by the centre on May 11, 2016 to celebrate National Technology Day. Dr. Atul Thakur was the resource person. Dr. Thakur apprised the faculty members about the various online courses related to use of ICT in Education from UNESCO, Microsoft and other foreign universities. He also explained the process and procedure for enrolling in these courses. The programme concluded with an interactive session.



INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) being the integral part of the college works towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement by developing a system of conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in different aspects of functioning of the college. The IQAC assures the stakeholders i.e. students, parents, teachers and would be employers to create accountability and transparency in the quality management system of the institution and its concern for ensuring quality of education being imparted.

QUALITY AUDITS

To evaluate the effectiveness of the quality management system of the college, internal and external audits were conducted as per the ISO 9001:2008 standards. A team of internal auditors audited the processes and the procedures of the College and gave valuable suggestions for the continual improvement of the system. Dr. Sunil Thaman from STSERVICIO, Chandigarh conducted the external audit on October 7, 2015 and also provided training on the ISO 9001:2015 standards to apprise about the latest changes in the ISO standards.




VALUE ADDED PROGRAMMES

ORIENTATION ON "CENTRAL TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST"






